Because of its toxins (protoenemonin), liverwort was used in folk medicine in the Middle Ages. In overdose, the poison causes vomiting, diarrhea as well as dizziness, among other things, it irritates the mucous membranes and affects the nervous system, causing convulsions and paralysis. Externally, sensitive individuals may experience irritation of the skin. The curative effect and medicinal use take place in bronchitis and diseases of the respiratory tract, it has also been applied to the liver, kidneys and spleen.
