Hepatica nobilis 'Rote Glut'

Found by my son Björn-Timo Peters in 1990, as a bud mutation of a red flowering simple Hepatica. After we could separate the vegetation eye, the plant developed slowly. Since there is no other double red Hepatica in Europe except 'Rubra Plena', not in this color intensity, we tried to propagate it in a laboratory. However, the success remained very questionable, from 500 individuals about 100 were filled again, the rest were back to normal dark red. The duration of this experiment was seven years. Now we propagate them again normally via vegetative. In the meantime we have a seedling from the Invitro unfilled, this is again just as filled and also colored like the origin 'Rote Glut'. So the round dance goes on and you need time!

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
